### **Early Years**

#### **Smooth Transitions Toolkit**

- A smooth transition toolkit was developed by EYFS Lead and training was cascaded to EYFS team
- Three Ready for Reception meetings and play sessions were held to familiarise children with the learning environment and the EYFS team
- Four morning and afternoon play sessions were held for parents of children starting Nursery to introduce them to the learning environment and the EYFS team
- September starters Getting to know you meetings/home visits have taken place for new starters
- Reception children new to Field Lane were visited in feeder settings and meetings with the Key Person took place
- Home visits for children starting Nursery in September took place


### **Early Years**

### Reading

#### **Phonics**

Miss Potts monitored phonics books across school and has identified some areas to address next term around key skills and teacher feedback.

### **Reading Challenge**

- Our Reading Challenge winners received a lovely new book and certificate
- Winners were chosen, not just for doing lots of reading but also for completing their diary and reviews
- These children have shown a positive attitude towards reading.







### Reading

### **Key Stage 1 CPD**

- KS1 teachers attended the 4th session of the reading for understanding course and fed back to the group
- The focus in session 4 was on planning a complete sequence of work - activating prior knowledge, delving at a deeper level, SATs style questioning.
- KS1 teachers will plan a reading unit next half term based on this format

#### **Reading CPD**

Miss Potts delivered a mini cpd session to teachers on storytime, this included

- revisiting the reading framework and a discussion around the impact of reading aloud through storytime
- revisiting and reviewing our story authors list, to include new and current authors.

### **Year 5 Reading**

- Y5 have been working in small groups to develop their reading fluency and questioning skills
- They have been supported with answering 3 mark questions, eg what impression do you get
- Y5 have made use of Pixl resources to improve reading skills
- They have been experimenting with techniques such as visualization.





### Writing

### **Writing For Pleasure**

- Year 5 embarked on some free writing based on the old classic "Dracula."
   They have been really inspired and motivated, trying to replicate the author's style of creating atmosphere.
- One student wrote, "I could not escape his eyes... They were charmingly demonic. My blood was boiling and his eyes widened."
- Reception children used their phonics skills to write recounts about sports day
- Y3/4 took on the role of newspaper reporters and wrote newspaper reports
- As part of the Democracy for Schools Award, Year 6 wrote letters to the local councillors persuading them to help improve Whitaker Pitch





### Writing

**Inspired by the Paris** Olympics, Years 3 and 4 have been writing non-chronological reports about their sporting heroes.



### **Writing Moderation**

- The English lead, Miss Potts, moderated samples of independent writing
- Writing was moderated against year group expectations
- Feedback has been provided to teachers





### **Oracy**



#### **PERFORMANCES**

Early Years performed the Three Billy Goats Gruff Musical story to the whole school, giving them the opportunity to develop their confidence to speak in speaking to an audience. Year 2 performed an assembly about plants, lifecycles and the benefits of nature. Children were involved in performing poetry, song, acting and dance. During rehearsals they worked on projecting their voices and pace of speech for clarity. Year 6 performed their end of year play with impeccable comic timing!

In the Carry My Story project Y5 have had a big focus on developing their oracy skills, especially active listening. They met Natalia, a refugee from Ukraine and listened to her story. They then had to ask her open ended questions, which were linked to events in her life. The children then presented a performance at the Al Hikmah Centre.

### **CPD**

Miss Potts delivered some CPD on active listening. Following that, teachers taught two lessons using the Pixl resources focussing on verbal and non- verbal communication and active listening. During the Year 3 lesson, learning was captured in ther floorbook, with some very impressive understanding of what they were learning and why.







### **Mathematics**

Our maths results this year is a reflection of how hard the staff and children have worked! Interventions have helped learners reach the expected standard. Staff have been supported with adaptive teaching so that children can 'keep up' instead of needing to 'catch up'.

### **Intent Implementation Impact**

The maths curriculum statement has been reviewed so that it is in line with the school curriculum statement and reflects the S.T.A.R. Values.

#### **SATS: Maths**

- 90% expected standard (This is above local and national average)
- 40% greater depth (This is above local and national average)

### Y4 Multiplication Check

- 21.7% scored 25/25 (This is above local and national average)
- 66.7% scored between 21-25
   (This is above local and national average)





### **Mathematics**

#### Year 6 learner

"First, I used to find maths difficult but now I feel confident. The staff have helped me to improve. The maths interventions helped me to learn things that I found difficult."

### Year 5 learner

"Maths is seen as one of the harder subjects but if you put your mind to it, you can do it! I enjoy solving maths problems because it gets my brain working and helps me focus."

#### Year 5 learner

"Maths used to be easier but it's been harder in Year 5. I found reasoning work tricky but the teachers and the interventions have helped me become more confident."

#### Year 6 learner

"When I was younger, I found maths a little boring because I found it difficult. Then the teachers helped me and made me feel more confident in maths. I scored 107 in my maths SATS! I am really proud about this!"





### **Science**

#### **Science CPD**

 The science lead met with a science teacher from UBHS to talk about Science learning in primary schools

### **Dental Hygiene**

 Dental hygiene videos were sent out to parents, to raise awareness of the importance of regular brushing

### **Science in Early Years**

Planted grass seeds and tested where they would grow, building on prior knowledge of what plants need to grow.

Tested vehicles and other found objects to find out which were magnetic.

Exploring speed of vehicles made by children

Building on prior knowledge of floating, predicting whether objects will float or sink

As part of their learning on Rivers. Years 3 and 4, went Pond dipping. They caught different things in their nets and classified them using a chart.

- The students interviewed previous Field Lane students about their meals from the past









### Geography

#### Y3/4 Trip to Nell Bank

The children visited the River Wharfe. They walked from the source of the river, explored the tributaries and played pooh sticks on the middle course. They observed the river's meander. This trip provided the children with a real experience to concrete their understanding of these concepts.





Katie mapped the different habitats in school and uploaded them to the Education Nature Park database.

#### **EYFS**

Focused on maps - drawing and following simple directions

Year 2, 5 and 3 have been getting to know their environment and its biodiversity. They had lots of fun creating 3d maps of the playground and its different habitats, using loose parts and natural resources.


**Balance Bikes workshops and CPD** 


Both Reception and Y1 classes have enjoyed taking part in 3 balance bike sessions over the summer term. They have been busy working on their gliding skills and then working towards

### **French**

#### Summer 1

Children in Years 3-4 have been learning the story: Les Quatre Amis. They've used listening and speaking skills. Together we have read a story fully in French, used translation skills and word banks.

### Our Year 5-6 classes -learnt about weather forecasts and the seasons.

They have learnt new vocabulary, took part in word hunts around the playground, used word banks and used these to make their own weather forecast with a partner speaking together in French.



#### Year 3-4 - At the market and vegetables

Children learnt about intercultural understanding, French culture about food and buying food at markets.

They learnt new vocabulary about different vegetables and were able to speak about their likes and dislikes.

## Children in Years 5-6 -have learnt new vocabulary about French beaches and seaside resorts.

They have learnt about French beach holidays, vocabulary linked to the seaside, spoken and written sentences using French postcard responses.


