## Parent/Carer Comments January 2024

I have highly recommended this school to family and friends.

My child is generally happy during his time at school, when I pick him up he is happy and smiling.

Really happy with the support my children get at school. The school has a very friendly and welcoming atmosphere. My children really look forward to coming.

I am very happy to send my children to Field Lane because all the staff are always ready to help the children and parents. I also like the Reading and Maths workshops. Excellent school, staff are amazing and my children have always enjoyed their time at school.

It is nice that Mrs Towers and Mr Lorgat make the time to be in the school playground after school. Mrs Laher in Nursery does a fantastic job supporting my child with his school lunch.

My daughter is making a progress in her reading and Math. It is helpful to see the reading journal how my daughter is doing her her reading.

Field Lane is a wonderful school where children thrive and are encouraged to reach their full potential.

My child is happy to attend school and it's lovely to see him skipping in every morning. My child learns through exciting and through a variety of different learning methods and is happy to share what he has learnt in school.

I am happy with my children's experience of the school. My children always say that my teacher is so lovely, can do everything and they have them as a role model and want to be teachers when they grow up.

My daughter is making good progress. I would prefer to have more updates - maybe every couple weeks - a brief update (a sentence or 2) on class dojo of what she does really well on and what she needs to improve on. Mrs Chibda did post a comment on class dojo last week and I really appreciated that.

I feel the school could do better in the following areas ... 1) school could be more involved with children's behaviour/building good character as they spend a good 6-7 hours at school. 2)parents need more and regular updates on their progress. There could be more effective communication on class dojo about their learning progress, use class dojo instead of sending messages via children. 3) school doesn't respond effectively with raised concerns. 4) involve parents more often eg, parents to be allowed for assemblies, class sessions.

## Areas for development

I'd like to know more frequently, where my child is lagging, I feel we are told at parents teacher meetings which is fine but there is a long gap between them. Don't give enough notice for meetings/ events so parents can't get time enough to attend.

I think the children's behaviour is an issue with the parenting rather than the school. Perhaps school could do a workshop for parents on manners, how we should treat each other kindly and with respect and how

to instill this in our children?

Teacher to provide an action plan in areas of what my child needs to improve in.To communicate more with parents about their learning and development.

I think the process (where the teacher says can I have a word to the parent) when a child has misbehaved is bit poor, especially in view of other parents who are potentially there. A more discreet method, possibly a personal message to parents would be better.

One thing that I would like to be different is parents evening, maybe to add one more or the existing ones to be a bit longer. We are grateful to be part of Field Lane Family.
